Singapore Watermark Awards recgonise leading organisations in Singapore that exhibit a profound dedication to effective water management, ongoing efforts in water efficiency, innovative water conservation practices, and active community engagement to inspire action and garner support for the water cause.



Employee & Community Engagement

SSMC's commitment to water sustainability is evident in their avid community engagement and water advocacy — from participating regularly in Singapore World Water Day, to organising educational tours and sharing sessions for students. They connect with schools by virtually sharing their Water Efficiency Management Journey and offering an educational tour of their facility. This aims to educate students about the process and importance of water recycling.

SSMC is also training staff volunteer docents for the Lorong Halus Wetlands Learning Trail, with plans to educate the community on the importance of keeping our catchment areas and waterways clean.

Over the years, more than 50% of employees participated in SSMC's improvement crowdsourcing platform. In 2023, SSMC invited employees to contribute water conservation ideas to promote engagement in water conversation efforts. More than 35 ideas had been qathered and piped for implementation.

PUB celebrates winners

of three water efficiency awards

In March 2024, Singapore's National Water Agency PUB announced the three winners of Singapore Watermark Awards (SWMA), Amazon Web Services (AWS) Singapore, Mee Toh School and Systems on Silicon Manufacturing Company (SSMC) clinched the nation's highest accolade that honours organisations that advance the water sustainability agenda.

AWS SINGAPORE

Positioned within the top 10% of performers in the data centre sector, AWS Singapore has implemented a water-efficient cooling tower design for their data centres to reduce water consumption. AWS data centres use on average less than 0.19L globally to cool 1kWh of IT load, compared to the industry average of 1.8L for the same load, according to Amazon Global water sustainability lead Will Hewes, "Today, all AWS data centres in Singapore are running on recycled NEWater water," he said. "AWS also piloted and deployed a water recycling system in Singapore which we codeveloped with a local startup Hydroleap, and we plan to scale this across the Asia-Pacific region."

MEE TOH SCHOOL

On Mee Toh School campus, sensors are installed at taps and water coolers to reduce water wastage. To ensure that underground water leakage does not go undetected, operations staff monitor water usage by checking water meters daily. Between 2019 and 2022, the school lowered their annual water consumption by 30%.

This co-ed primary school has hands-on water conservation initiatives such as its rainwater collection system, which harnesses rainwater for use in the cleaning of common spaces, watering of plants, and students' projects. "In Mee Toh, what is unique is that we incorporate this into our environmental education programme, so we structure the curriculum around water," principal Wang-Tan Sun Sun said. "We hope our students will grow up as responsible eco-stewards that champion for environment and water sustainability."

This is the second Watermark Award for SSMC, which was recognised for being a water saver champion in the semiconductor industry back in 2013, SSMC has achieved the highest recycling rates since 2015, at an average of 67% as compared to the industry average of 45%. "In SSMC, every drop of water that we use here is recycled 2.8 times," said CEO Lim Soon. They have achieved this through active water recycling strategies, such as using NEWater in 100% of their operations and innovating new wastewater treatment methodologies.

However, this journey in water conservation has not always been smooth sailing, according to the CEO. The challenges were technical constraints, talent and the semiconductor business downcycles when the industry is on a cost-conservation mode. "Investing in water recycling technologies then becomes difficult because when it is competing with other priorities," he said. "But in this long-haul journey, we have a

clear vision on the importance of sustainability, both water as well as electricity. This clear vision has continuously kept us on this journey for the last more than 20 years." The CEO also credited collective support from its board of directors, shareholders and employees, which brought this long-term vision to life.

PUB INITIATIVES TO MANAGE WATER DEMAND IN SINGAPORE

This year, there were 35 Water Efficiency Awards (WEA) winners from 12 sectors in Singapore and eight WEA (Projects) recipients. The biennial WEA recognises the top 10th percentile of water-efficient performers in different sectors; and the inaugural projects category under WEA - has been introduced to recognise water efficiency projects from non-domestic industrial water users.

A total of 46 winners, ranging from manufacturing plants and data centres to commercial buildings and schools, received these awards. Minister for sustainability and the environment and minister-in-charge

of trade relations Grace Fu and senior parliamentary secretary for sustainability and the environment and transport Baey Yam Keng presented the awards during a ceremony at Gardens by the Bay on 26 Mar 2024.

According to minister Fu, these awards are part of PUB efforts to water demand management. Another PUB initiative to support businesses to become water-efficient is the mandatory water recycling for water-intensive sectors like wafer fabrication electronics, and biomedical industries - which collectively account for 17% of the current non-domestic water demand.

Furthermore, PUB has raised its Water Efficiency Fund (WEF) from S\$1m to \$5m, to provide increased financial support to businesses in their water recycling journey, "To date. PUB has awarded close to 400 grants for water efficiency projects, which collectively save 70 million litres of water each day," she said. VV///




